COURSE CONTENT

Ninth grade is the first year of a two-year sequence focusing on global history. At the end of the second year of study, you will take a cumulative New York State Regents Examination in Global History & Geography. We will begin this year with a brief review of the origin of humans and human development. We will then move on to the first of the seven major areas of the world to be examined this year—Latin America. Latin America will be viewed from the social science perspectives of geography, history, culture, economics, and politics. The other remaining areas to be explored in similar fashion are Africa, South Asia, China, Japan, Europe and the Middle East. In addition, we will continually look at the relationship of current events to what we are studying about each region and any cross-cultural aspects the regions share.
